

Brother's and Sisters in Christ,


We are just weeks away from the start of Lent and I always get excited to think about those 40 days as we journey to Easter. Christmas is always special but there is just something so meaningful when you realize just how much Jesus Christ did for us during those last weeks before his death and resurrection. This Lenten season we will be looking at how God's love is shown to us each week through our sermon series on Wednesday at 11:30 and at our 6:00pm services:

- 2/18 - Ash Wednesday – Redemptive Love - *Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord. Romans 7:24-25*
- 2/25 – Compassionate Love –*As a father shows compassion to his children, so the Lord shows compassion to those who fear him. Psalm 103:13*
- 3/4 – Steadfast Love - *Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever. Psalm 118:1*
- 3/11 – Enriching Love - *I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus, that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge. 1 Corinthians 1:4-5*
- 3/18 – Living Love - *And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father full of grace and truth. John 1:14*
- 3/25 – Holy Love - *Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for. Isaiah 6:7*
- 3/29 – Palm Sunday – Saving Love - *So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the king of Israel!" John 12:13*
- 4/2 – Maundy Thursday – Selfless Love - *A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, so you also are to love one another. By this will all people know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. John 13:34-35*
- 4/3 – Good Friday – Sacrificial Love - *Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. Hebrews 10:18*
- 4/5 – Easter – Joyous Love - *May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope. Romans 15:13*

Sunday mornings will continue to be our traditional and contemporary lectionary services and we will be having a Bible study beginning March 1st at 10:00-10:40 each week through Lent.

I look forward to walking the journey of the Lenten season with you and hope that you are able to attend most, if not all, of the services to prepare for the celebration of the Risen Lord on that glorious Easter Morning!!!

To improve the self-esteem of adolescent girls through empowerment of self and service to others

Results:

7 in 10 BIO girls participants experience an increase in self-esteem & 50% report decreased anxiety symptoms.

Program Overview:

BIO (Beautiful Inside & Out) Girls is a self-esteem building program serving girls grades 2-6. A BIO Girls program meets for 12 sessions, 90 minutes each.

Each session combines:

- Christian, Non-Denominational Devotions
- Life-Skills Lessons
- Mentoring
- Physical Activity



Bringing brokenness to the cross during Lent is an invitation to swap shame for grace, acknowledging personal sins, weaknesses, and wounds by laying them at Jesus' feet. This season encourages relying on Christ's sacrifice rather than personal effort, trusting that God transforms broken pieces into new life.

Key Aspects of Bringing Brokenness to the Cross:

- **A Season of Truth:** Lent provides a space for honest, non-judgmental acknowledgment of pain, grief and sin, allowing individuals to stop pretending they are okay.
- **Laying Down Idols:** Contrition involves identifying "idols" like money, pride or success, and bringing these, along with broken relationship to the cross for restoration.
- **Vulnerability and Grace:** Instead of fear or guilt, this practice fosters hope in a God who meets people in their "dust", providing healing and strength of the Holy Spirit.
- **Healing through the Cross:** The ultimate goal is to move from self-reliance to dependency on Christ, experiencing the forgiveness that turns brokenness into a source of beauty and wholeness.

Lent is not about punishing oneself but about allowing Jesus to heal the broken heart. We will be creating a cross of broken pieces that each of us will be a part of. **Before or after each service be sure to stop at the mosaic cross and glue a tile or two onto the cross (leave a little bit of space from the tile next to it) and we will cover that cross throughout the Lenten season.**

The beauty of giving all our broken pieces to the Cross and to Jesus will be seen on Easter Morning when the cross is complete and the Lord has been raised!!
